GENERAL INFORMATION

INSTRUCTIONS

Step 1: Competitors must enter Mini-Gathering events on-line and pay by credit card at www.bcpipers.org. If you do not have a credit card, you may use a Visa® Gift Card purchased at any of the following locations. In Canada: Vancity credit unions, Shoppers Drug Mart, Pharmasave, 7-Eleven, and other retail outlets. In the USA: Wells Fargo, PNC Bank, US Bank, and other retail outlets.

Step 2: You should print this information document in order to read the information, music and rules requirements on both pages.

Step 3: You must complete all fields of the competitor information section online. Your BCPA Membership # is on your membership card. Select events, check the required confirmations, and complete payment.

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Mini-Gathering competitors are required to be current members (2019/20 year) of the BC Pipers' Association.

VENUE

The Mini-Gatherings are at Pitt River Middle School, 2070 Tyner Road, Port Coquitlam, BC, V3C 2Z1. Registration area will be in the Cafeteria.

Competition starts at 11:00 am each day. Doors open 45 minutes before competition begins. Depending on number of entries, events may start earlier. All events subject to time change.

Food service in the Cafeteria will be provided by a local junior pipe band.

ADMISSION FEES

There are no admission fees to watch the Mini-Gathering events. Spectators are encouraged to attend and watch the events.

GRAND AGGREGATE AWARDS

Please note that the 2019 Grand Aggregate Awards Ceremony will take place before the start of the November 2 Mini-Gathering at 10:15 am in the Cafeteria of Pitt River Middle School. Please attend and support the award recipients.

RULES

Mini-Gatherings competition events in piping and drumming are conducted under the rules of the BC Pipers Association (www.bcpipers.org) and are confined to current members of the BC Pipers Association.

ORDERS OF PLAY

Mini-Gathering events are *first to enter, last to play*, however all "early bird" entries received by 11:59 pm September 27 will be considered to be randomly received on September 27.

All Mini-Gatherings orders of play will be posted on the BCPA website (www.bcpipers.org) at least one week before each competition and at the Competition Secretary's area when the doors open on competition days.

Competitors must check in with the registration desk and with the individual event steward at the start of each of their events. Competitors not ready to play in the posted order may be disqualified. Competitors are required to report any event performance time conflicts to the applicable stewards.

SCHEDULES AND ROOMS MAP

Schedules will be posted on the BCPA website at least three days before each competition.

A map of the competition rooms and the tuning rooms will be posted at the Competition Secretary's area when the doors open on competition days.

Competitors shall not use the general tuning rooms more than 45 minutes before their performance time. Final tuning rooms are for use only by one competitor at a time and only available to that competitor when the preceding competitor goes on to compete.

TUNING TIME

Tuning time is a maximum three minutes (except piobaireachd which is a maximum five minutes).

HIGHLAND DRESS

Refer to the BCPA competition rules for appropriate highland dress.

PRIZES

For Mini-Gatherings, the prizes are certificates. The aggregate winner in each grade for the combined November and February Mini-Gatherings receives a perpetual shield at the February Mini-Gathering.

Winner of the "super aggregate" for Grade 1 Piping competitions will be a total aggregate score from the 2019/20 Mini-Gatherings and the 2020 Annual Gathering. This aggregate will be calculated on a total of all results of each event, being weighted equally. The winner receives up to a maximum of \$600 CDN toward an airline ticket to Ontario to compete in the George Sherriff Memorial Invitational competition. Winner must be a current BCPA member and reside in the BCPA sanctioning jurisdiction (BC, WA, OR). Winner must have also played in the Annual Gathering Grade 1 Piobaireachd, which will be used to break a tie.

Winner of the "super aggregate" for Grade 1 Snare Drumming competitions will be a total aggregate score from the 2019/20 Mini-Gatherings and the 2020 Annual Gathering. This aggregate will be calculated on a total of all results of each event, being weighted equally. The winner will receive up to a maximum of \$600 CDN toward an airline ticket to Scotland or Missouri to compete in the World Solo Drumming Championship or the Midwest Highland Arts Fund Winter Storm competitions, respectively. Winner must be a current BCPA member and reside in the BCPA sanctioning jurisdiction (BC, WA, OR). Winner must have also played in the Annual Gathering Grade 1 March, Strathspey & Reel, which will be used to break a tie.

For all travel related prizes, the amount allocated will be based on a flight originating in Vancouver or the winner's city whichever is lesser cost.

Piping and Drumming prize trips must be made in the year the prize is won or the allocation toward the travel will be forfeited.

CLASSROOM RULES

All classrooms are non-smoking & non-alcoholic areas.

It is very important to the BCPA that the content of all classrooms not be disturbed during the Mini-Gatherings and that, at the end of the competitions, all rooms be returned to their original condition.

All personal items and belongings must be removed from the classrooms by 3:45 pm and doors will be locked at this time.
