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#### **EVENTS SCHEDULE**

Friday events - Doors open one hour before competition starts.

Competition begins **9 am** (Piobaireachd for Grades Adult, 4, 3, 2, 1, Open, and CPA), **4 pm** (Open Snare Drumming and Open Tenor Drumming). **Dependent on entry numbers, events may start earlier/later. All events subject to time change. Check the online schedule 3 days ahead.** 

Saturday events - Doors open one hour before competition starts. Competition begins 8:30 am for solo piping and drumming, 3:00 pm for band contest. Dependent on entry numbers, events may start earlier/later. All events subject to time change. Check the online schedule 3 days ahead.

#### ADMISSION FEES

There are no admission fees to watch solo events. Spectators are encouraged to attend and watch the events. Admission to the Open Piping, Open Drumming, and RSPBA Adult Snare Drumming Pacific Rim Championship events is by donation.

Spectator admission tickets to the band competition and awards ceremony are available for advance purchase for \$10 for age 11 and over non-competitors. A separate link for purchasing band competition admission tickets is on the BCPA Wild Apricot website. Price will be higher at the door.

There will be complimentary seating for performing band members at the back of the Theatre during the Band Contest, if seats are available. Players must be in uniform.

Admission to the "After Hours" Ceilidh is free.

#### SENIOR ADJUDICATOR DRUMMING WORKSHOPS

The Senior Drumming Adjudicator will conduct workshops at the Annual Gathering venue for snare drummers on the Friday. Admission is free.

10:00 am - 11:15 am (for solo grades Beginner, 4, and 3)

11:30 am - 1:00 pm (for solo grades 2, 1)

2:00 pm – 3:00 pm (for drumming instructors)

#### SPECIAL EVENT: CPA (COMPETING PIPERS ASSOCIATION) COMBINED B&C GRADES PIOBAIREACHD EVENT

This event is officially sanctioned and recognized by the Competing Pipers Association.

Competitors must be current CPA "B" or "C" Grade members and provide proof of CPA membership with your entry. CPA Junior members are not permitted to compete in this event. The CPA website is <a href="https://www.competingpipers.com">www.competingpipers.com</a>

The event will be adjudicated by a BCPA or ANAPBA affiliated association "A" Certificate Piobaireachd Adjudicator, an adjudicator from the CPA Supplementary List of Judges or the Solo Piping Judges Association Adjudicators List.

#### SPECIAL EVENT: ROYAL SCOTTISH PIPE BAND ASSOCIATION PACIFIC RIM SOLO DRUMMING CHAMPIONSHIP

Hosted by the British Columbia Pipers' Association (BCPA), this competition forms part of the new RSPBA International Solo Drumming circuit for 2023.

This event is officially recognised and sanctioned by the RSPBA and will be conducted according to RSPBA rules and will be adjudicated by accredited RSPBA adjudicators. All competitors must meet the required criteria to compete in the 2023 Adult World Solo Drumming Championship. Before entering, competitors should understand the RSPBA rules (<a href="https://rspba.org/2022/10/22/the-rspba-adult-solo-snare-drumming-championship-2023/">https://rspba.org/2022/10/22/the-rspba-adult-solo-snare-drumming-championship-2023/</a>)

The Championship will also enable the top 4 placed competitors who have not already pre-qualified for the World Solo Drumming Championships to enter the World Solo Drumming Championships as a semi-finalist in October 2023 in Scotland.

The winner of this event will receive the J. Reid Maxwell medal. Monetary prizes are sponsored by Tartantown and BCPA.

#### BCPA "AFTER HOURS" CEILIDH

The BCPA "After Hours" Ceilidh begins at the Annual Gathering venue immediately after the Saturday band contest and awards presentation.

Aggregate winners of all solo grades in piping, snare drumming, and tenor drumming are encouraged to play.

#### **RULES**

All events, except the RSPBA Adult Snare Drumming Pacific Rim Championship, are conducted under the rules of the BC Pipers' Association (<a href="www.bcpipers.org">www.bcpipers.org</a>). The RSPBA Adult Snare Drumming Pacific Rim Championship is conducted under the rules of the Royal Scottish Pipe Band Association. The CPA (Competing Pipers Association) Combined B&C Grades Piobaireachd event is officially sanctioned and recognized by the Competing Pipers Association.

All bands shall compete as a full Band. All bands shall present in Concert formation.

The Annual Gathering Most Points Award will be calculated using solo events with a minimum of 6 players who actually compete.

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#### ORDER OF PLAY

Orders of play (OOP) for Grade 1, Intermediate, Open Piping, Open Snare Drumming, Open Tenor Drumming, CPA Combined B&C, and Bands will be determined by random draw. The random draw will take place one day after closing date at the Competition Secretary's address. For other events, the entries received by 11:59 pm on early-bird date are considered to be randomly received on that early bird date. After the early bird date, the OOP continues in reverse order of entry date ("earlier to enter, later to play" format).

All OOPs will be posted on the BCPA website (www.bcpipers.org) one week before each competition and at the Competition Secretary's area when the doors open on competition days. Schedules will be posted on the BCPA website three days before each competition and posted at the Registration Area when the doors open on competition days.

#### CHECK IN

Competitors must check in at the registration area on arrival <u>and</u> with the individual event steward before the start time of each of their events. Competitors not ready to play in the posted order may be disqualified. Competitors are required to report any event performance time conflicts to the applicable stewards.

#### TUNE SELECTION

For events where more than one tune or set is required to be submitted, tune selection for solo events will be conducted by the adjudicator at the time the competitor presents to perform, except for Grade 2, 1, and Open Piping, CPA Combined B&C Piobaireachd, Open Snare Drumming events, and RSPBA Adult Snare Drumming Pacific Rim Championship.

For Grade 2, 1, and Open Piping, CPA Combined B&C, and Open Snare Drumming events, tunes and sets shall be submitted online or to entries@bcpipers.org by closing date. Competitors entered for these events may submit tune changes to the BCPA Competition Secretary (entries@bcpipers.org) up to the entry deadline.

For Grade 2, 1, and Open Piping and CPA Combined B&C events, the competitor will receive their selected tune when they enter the final tuning area to compete. For Open Snare Drumming events, the selected set for each competitor in each event will be posted 3 hours before the start of the competition at the Competition Secretary's area.

Set submission and set selection for the RSPBA Adult Snare Drumming Pacific Rim Championship will be according to the rules of the Royal Scottish Pipe Band Association.

If the Grade 2, 1, and Open Piping, CPA B&C, or Open Snare Drumming competitor does not submit their tunes or sets by the entry deadline, the competitor shall inform the adjudicator of the tunes or sets for the event at his/her scheduled competition time and the adjudicator shall indicate which tune or set is to be performed.

For band events, selection of MSR (Grades 1 & 2) will be conducted by Chief Steward when the band is on the stage.

#### HIGHLAND DRESS

Refer to the BCPA competition rules for appropriate highland dress.

#### TUNING TIME

Tuning time is a maximum of three minutes (except piobaireachd which is a maximum of five minutes).

#### PRIZES

For solo events other than Open and CPA, prizes are medals or certificates. For solo Open, CPA, RSPBA Adult, and Band events, monetary prizes are awarded. The band monetary prizes will be awarded as an aggregate prize. The aggregate winner in each grade receives a perpetual trophy.

**Grade 5 Piping**. A tuition scholarship to the upcoming Piping Hot Summer Drummer Summer School (donated by Piping Hot Summer Drummer) will be awarded to the Most Promising Piper as jointly determined by the adjudicators of the Grade 5 Piping events.

The winner of the Grade 2 Piping aggregate will be awarded a tuition scholarship to the next Celtic Arts Foundation Winter School (donated by the Celtic Arts Foundation). A tie for the tuition scholarship shall be broken on Piobaireachd, then March, Strathspey & Reel preference.

The winner of the "super aggregate" for Grade 1 Piping competitions will be based on a total aggregate score from the last 2 Mini-Gatherings and this Annual Gathering. This aggregate will be calculated on a total of all results of each event, being weighted equally. The winner receives up to a maximum of \$600 CDN toward an airline ticket to Ontario to compete in the George Sherriff Memorial Invitational competition. Winner must have also played in the Annual Gathering Grade 1 Piobaireachd (#152), which will be used to break a tie.

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The **Open Piping Aggregate** winner receives up to \$800 CDN toward an airline ticket to the UK to compete in the Argyllshire Gathering, Northern Meeting, or Scottish Piping Society of London competitions. The winner must play in events 161, 162, & 164 to qualify. The result of the Piobaireachd event (#162) will be used to break a tie.

**Grade 4 Snare Drumming**. A tuition scholarship to the upcoming Piping Hot Summer Drummer Summer School (donated by Piping Hot Summer Drummer) will be awarded to the Most Promising Snare Drummer as jointly determined by the adjudicators of the Grade 4 Snare Drumming events.

The winner of the **Grade 2 Snare Drumming aggregate** will be awarded a tuition scholarship to the next Celtic Arts Foundation Winter School (donated by the Celtic Arts Foundation). A tie for the tuition scholarship shall be broken on March, Strathspey & Reel preference.

The winner of the "super aggregate" for Grade 1 Snare Drumming competitions will be based on a total aggregate score from the last 2 Mini-Gatherings and this Annual Gathering. This aggregate will be calculated on a total of all results of each event, being weighted equally weighted. The winner will receive up to \$600 CDN toward an airline ticket to Scotland or Missouri to compete in the World Solo Drumming Championship or the Midwest Highland Arts Fund Winter Storm competitions, respectively. The winner must have also played in Annual Gathering events 251 and 252. The result of the MSR event (#251) will be used to break a tie.

The **Open Snare Drumming Aggregate** winner receives up to \$800 CDN toward an airline ticket to Scotland or Missouri to compete in the World Solo Drumming Championship or the Midwest Highland Arts Fund Winter Storm competitions, respectively. The winner must play in events 261 and 262 to qualify. The result of the MSR (#261) event will be used to break a tie.

The winner of the "super aggregate" for Intermediate Tenor Drumming competitions will be a total aggregate score from the last 2 Mini-Gatherings and this Annual Gathering. This aggregate will be calculated on a total of all results of each event, being weighted equally. The winner will receive up to a maximum of \$600 CDN toward an airline ticket to Scotland or Missouri to compete in the World Solo Tenor Drumming Championship or the Midwest Highland Arts Fund Winter Storm competitions, respectively. Winner must have also played in Annual Gathering events 351 and 352. The result of the MSR event (#351) will be used to break a tie.

The **Open Tenor Drumming Aggregate** winner receives up to \$600 CDN toward an airline ticket to the Scotland or Missouri to compete in the World Solo Drumming Championship or the Midwest Highland Arts Fund Winter Storm competitions, respectively. The winner must play in events 361 and 362 to gualify. The result of the MSR event (#361) will be used to break a tie.

For Open and CPA solo events, the total purse is over \$5,400, including travel prizes. For band events, the total purse is over \$3,500. The value of prizes will be provided on written request of the BCPA Competition Secretary at entries@bcpipers.org

Band prize monies will not be awarded until all tuning rooms have passed inspection.

#### ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR TRAVEL PRIZES

Four or more players must compete in each event for the travel prize for a music discipline and grade to be awarded.

Winner must be a current Active, Junior or Life BCPA member and must primarily reside in the BCPA sanctioning jurisdiction (BC, WA, OR).

For all travel related prizes, the amount allocated will be based on a flight originating in Vancouver or the winner's city whichever is the lesser cost.

Piping and Drumming prize trips must be made within 12 months of this Annual Gathering or the allocation toward the travel will be forfeited.

If a prize trip is not made by the winner or the requirements for the specific travel prize are not met, the monies will be re-allocated to the respective Piping, Snare Drumming, or Tenor Drumming travel support fund for BCPA members.

#### SATURDAY AWARDS CEREMONY

The awards ceremony will take place immediately after the Saturday band contest. The BCPA places great emphasis on dignity and presentation at the awards ceremony. First prize and aggregate winners must appear in Highland dress to receive their awards on stage.

#### **CLASSROOM RULES**

All classrooms are non-smoking, non-vaping, non-drug & non-alcoholic areas.

It is very important to the BCPA that the content of all classrooms not be disturbed during the events and that, at the end of the competitions, all rooms be returned to their original condition.

All personal items and belongings must be removed from the classrooms by **7:00 pm**, doors will be locked at this time. Pipers may keep their pipes with them in a designated area in the Theatre during the band contest and awards ceremony.

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The indicated representative for a band is responsible for checking in with the Chief Steward upon arrival and for maintaining integrity of the room to which the band is assigned.
